CHP Leadership Report

As I think back over this past year at Care House Partnerships, I might say it has been one of the most challenging years in ministry I've experienced. Yes, amazing things have happened at CHP this year.

- We saw our biggest year of giving ever.
- The Care House Food Bank distributed over 1.3 million pounds of food ... that's right ... over one million pounds of food to our community.
- We began our journey towards more intentionally serving our neighbors who are immigrants by creating programs for what we call Immigrant Welcome Services.
- Our Care House Clinic provided over \$50,000 in medical, dental, and counseling services to our community, surpassing \$250,000 in services over our lifetime..

These are truly amazing reports of impact on our community that you, our Care Partners, are responsible for due to your prayers, volunteerism, and financial support.

And yet there was great struggle because of what these numbers mean, especially as we strive to live out the biblical mandate to love one's neighbor, to love the poor, to love the immigrant, and to love one's enemy as God has loved us. Due to various social, economic, and political events of the past year, life has become more of a struggle for our neighbors who are poor, part of the workforce population, and/or immigrants. Many of these individuals and households have experienced tremendous stress, uncertainty, and discouragement like never before.

On the pages that follow, you will see how God used Care House Partnerships to bring hope and help in the midst of the unsettledness many have felt this past year. You will be amazed at how God has used our Care Partners to bring hope, nourishment, and life to Nampa, Canyon County, and the Treasure Valley. 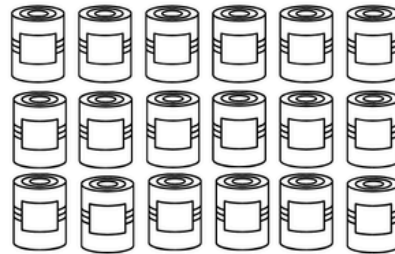

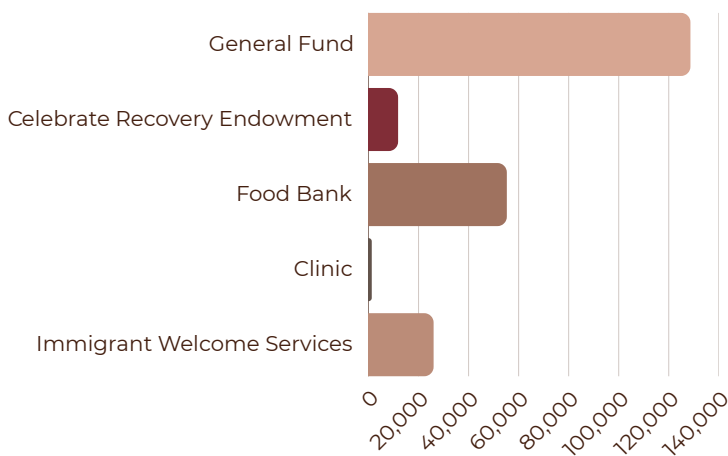
Celebrate Recovery serves 57 individuals each week, including adults, teens, and children.

Eighteen men and women participated in 12-Step Studies to help them better incorporate these principles into their lives.

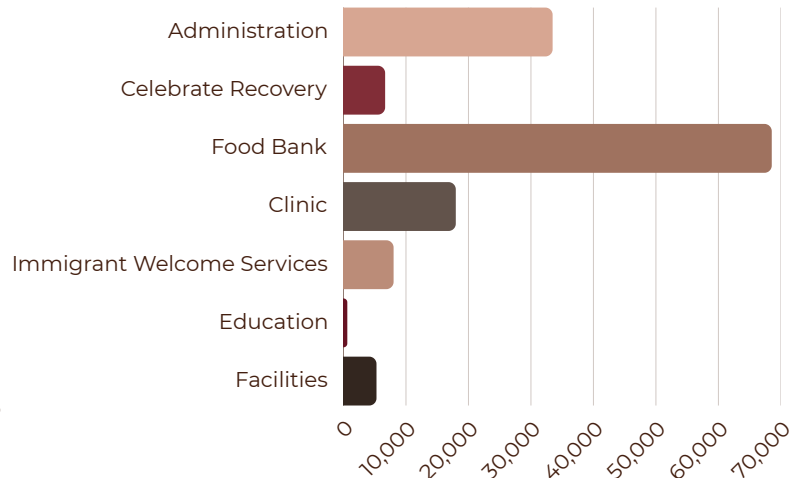

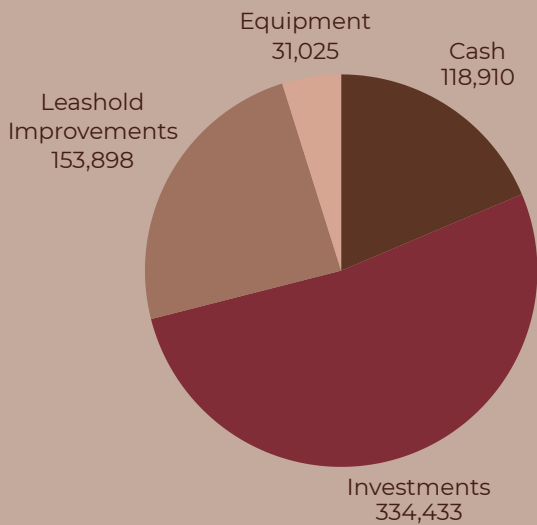


Total Expenses: \$141,229

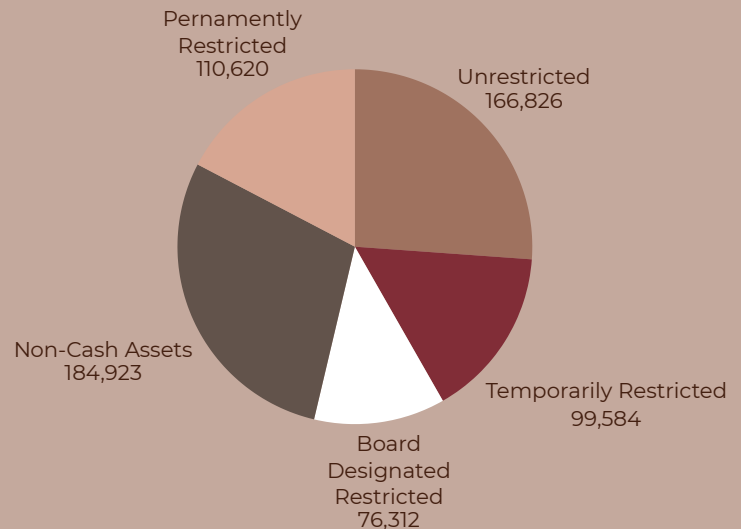

Care House Clinic

When my husband's job didn't offer health insurance, we felt completely stranded, especially as the cost of essential medication began to climb beyond our reach. The stress of watching a prescription run low while having no clear way to afford a refill was overwhelming, leaving us feeling like we were one health crisis away from disaster. Discovering the free medical clinic changed everything; for the first time in months, we weren't just a "case" without coverage, but people who deserved care. They didn't just provide a consultation; they helped us navigate the path to getting the medicine needed to stay healthy, finally lifting that heavy burden of uncertainty from our family.

For individuals without health insurance, this medical clinic is the only bridge between a health crisis and recovery. This clinic removes the paralyzing fear of medical debt, allowing patients to seek treatment for everything from common infections to chronic conditions like diabetes or high blood pressure without a bill. By providing professional consultations, basic lab work, and even assistance with low-cost prescriptions, this clinic ensures that a lack of insurance doesn't equal a lack of care. Ultimately, it restores dignity to the healthcare experience, proving that a person's physical well-being should never be determined by their employment status or financial standing.

Hello, my name is Jamie, and I am one of God's masterpieces in the making. Celebrate Recovery has had a profound impact on my life and my family. When we first came, we carried stress, unresolved hurt, and unhealthy patterns. We didn't always know how to express our feelings and often tried to handle everything on our own. Celebrate Recovery gave us a safe place to be honest, to listen, and to learn from others facing similar struggles.

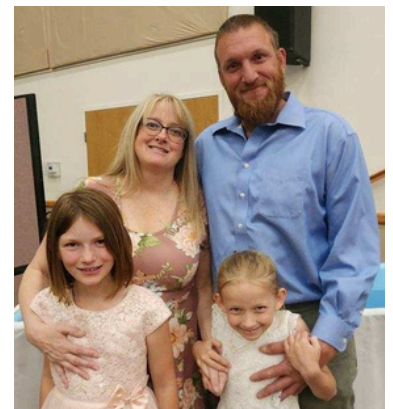
Two of the biggest changes for my growth have been learning to take responsibility for my growth and establishing healthy boundaries. The principles and steps helped me slow down, reflect, and understand the roots of my behavior instead of reacting to life. I've gained healthier coping skills that keep me grounded and connected to my faith. I've become more patient, open, and willing to ask for help. I used to worry about everything—most of which never happened, creating much of my own stress by trying to control everything. When I allowed God to take control, real change began.

For my family, Celebrate Recovery has created space for healing. We've learned to support each other without trying to fix everything, to listen better, and to show grace. We've begun breaking unhealthy cycles and replacing them with habits that bring us closer together. We've also found a supportive community—a “forever family”—that encourages and prays for us.

Celebrate Recovery hasn't just helped us through hard seasons; it's changed how we live. It has strengthened our relationships, deepened our faith, and given us hope. Through God, I've found peace, gratitude, and true joy—even in difficult times.

Care House Food Bank



For more than two decades, one name and face have been synonymous with the Care House Food Bank, aka, Nazarene Care House: Neal Moore. Neal's leadership became more pronounced when the ministry moved across the street from Nampa First Church of the Nazarene, to the house on the corner of 16th Ave S & 6th St. S. in/around 2026, and his fingerprints can be seen throughout the new facility and the community even today. Neal has been the individual that community groups like the Boy Scouts and the U.S. Postal Service call when a community food collection is happening and when schools like Liberty & Victory Charter Schools want to put together a food drive. Matter of fact, when North Nampa was designated as a 'food desert,' the Idaho Food Bank and community members reached out to Neal to begin monthly food distributions in that neighborhood, which then led to the development of the Traveling Table mobile food pantry and Good News Food Pantry.

Neal has been the heartbeat of the Care House Food Bank during this time. Under Neal's leadership, the CHFB became known as a place that was physically and emotionally safe for adults with intellectual disabilities to serve. The core values of "Food, Prayer, and Friendship" were developed as a guide for our volunteers to serve our neighbors in a manner that raises the dignity, value, and worth of those we serve. Central to Neal's heart is Jesus' calling to love one's neighbor as one wants to be loved.



Though Neal will be retiring from his leadership of the Care House Food Bank in December of 2026, his fingerprints will be on its ministry for years to come.

Immigrant Welcome Services & Immigration Assistance Center

Since Care House Partnerships' inception in 2016, it has been our desire to find the best pathway to serving the growing number of our neighbors who are immigrants. While the Care House Food Bank and the Care House Clinic do provide pathways for assistance for this community, there has been a greater need lying beneath the surface that needed to be addressed. After meeting with several community stakeholders about the needs of our immigrant neighbors, initial steps were taken to more intentionally service these neighbors.

One step was hosting our first session of Conversational English Classes in the spring of 2026. Under the leadership of Linda Friberg, our team empowered ten community neighbors in their English language skills as they strive to become more assimilated into our community.

Another step was CHP's creating a formal partnership with Immigrant Connection. Through this partnership, we will be developing a program in which individuals who have gone through the training necessary to become accredited by the United States Department of Justice to serve as non-attorney immigration representatives to those who are residing in the U.S. legally. Through this program, our team will be allowed to help our immigrant neighbors work through the maze that is the U.S. immigration system with confidence that they will not be taken advantage of. Our goal is to have this program accredited and operational by the spring of 2027.
